# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR BOARD MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SANTA MARIA PUBLIC AIRPORT DISTRICT HELD MARCH 14, 2024

The Board of Directors of the Santa Maria Public Airport District held a Regular Meeting at the regular meeting place at 6:00 p.m. Present were Directors Moreno, Adams, Clayton, and Baskett, General Manager, Pehl, Manager of Finance & Administration Reade, and District Counsel George. Director Brown was absent.

- 1. MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING HELD February 22, 2024. Director Baskett made a Motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held February 22, 2024. Director Adams Seconded and it was carried by a 4-0 vote.
- 2. COMMITTEE REPORT(S):
